 EBT online in select states. Currently, customers with a valid SNAP EBT card in the state of Florida can use their SNAP funds on Amazon and Walmart.



Visit www.Amazon.com/SNAP/Register and follow the instructions on the screen. If you are not already an Amazon customer, you will need to create an account and add your SNAP EBT card plus zip code to make sure that you are eligible. There are also opportunities to add an EBT card during checkout or in your wallet.



- Visit www.grocery.walmart.com and create an account. Add your EBT card to your account as a form of payment and select your EBT card as a the payment method during checkout.
- To determine if grocery delivery is available for your location, please visit the retailers' websites. The available delivery zip codes indicate where retailers are able to provide their full line of groceries, including perishable items. Please note, the use of EBT cards for the purchase of groceries is restricted for approved grocery items only and cannot be used for delivery fees.
- P-EBT benefits will be issued automatically during the month of June.



benefit will be added to your current EBT card automatically. For Medicaid and/or TANF recipients with a child receiving free and reduced-price school meals, the P-EBT benefit will be automatically mailed to the address on your Medicaid and/or TANF file. No further action is required on your part to receive your P-EBT benefits. For all other P-EBT customers, a new P-EBT card will be mailed to the address on file with your child's school district. No further action is required on your part to receive your P-EBT benefits. Please allow the state to fully issue all P-EBT benefits by June 30, 2020, before inquiring about your benefit status.
