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FAMILY SUPPORTS

Family Support Programs provide county-wide support to Broward families at risk for child abuse, neglect, out-of-home placement, or crisis. These programs use trauma-informed approaches to help families build resilience, improve parenting skills, and stay safe together.

a FAMILY STRENGTHENING

Family Strengthening Programs offer in-home and group-based support using proven parenting education curricula to help families build stronger relationships, improve communication, and create safe, nurturing environments for children.

Therapeutic Services, a higher-intensity initiative within Family Strengthening, provides voluntary in-home and community-based support to families at risk of child maltreatment. These services are grounded in trauma-informed practices and focus on building resilience in children and caregivers while addressing family challenges before they escalate.

**INTENSIVE
IN-HOME
SERVICES**

The HOMEBUILDERS® program is an intensive, evidence-based service designed to prevent children from being unnecessarily removed from their homes. It provides short-term, in-home support to families in crisis, teaching practical skills to improve family functioning and resolve issues that put children at risk.

Referrals to this program are made exclusively by the Broward Sheriff's Office Child Protective Investigations Section (BSO CPIS) for families with one or more children at immediate risk of out-of-home placement.

As part of a step-down approach, families who complete the HOMEBUILDERS® program and wish to continue receiving support may be referred to another CSC Broward Family Strengthening program for ongoing services.

d KINSHIP

Kinship Programs support families where children are being raised by relatives or close family friends because their biological parents are unable to care for them. These programs help maintain stable, loving homes and prevent children from entering foster care or institutional settings.

Services are available to both kinship caregivers and children from birth through age 17, and up to age 21 for youth with special physical, developmental, or behavioral needs. Caregivers may be relatives or non-relatives who have a strong, trusted bond with the child.

EARLY CHILDHOOD PROGRAMS

Early Childhood Programs provide children with a strong foundation for lifelong learning and success. These high-quality, affordable programs support early learning, social development, and emotional well-being in safe and nurturing environments.

a CHILDCARE SERVICES

This program provides affordable, high-quality childcare for low-income families living in Broward County, based on income eligibility. Its primary goals are to:

- Prevent child abuse and neglect
- Support families in becoming or remaining economically self-sufficient
- Prepare preschool-aged children to enter school ready to learn

Children from birth to age 5 in exceptionally vulnerable families receive quick access to subsidized childcare to help stabilize challenging family situations. By offering safe, nurturing environments for early learning, the program promotes healthy development and sets children on a path toward long-term success.

b EARLY LITERACY INTERVENTIONS

These programs help young children build essential academic skills through targeted reading and math support while encouraging curiosity, confidence, and positive social interactions. As part of this effort, trained Florida Reading Corps tutors work in PreK classrooms at underperforming schools across Broward County. All students are screened to identify those who may be behind in early literacy. Tutors then develop individualized intervention plans to meet each child's specific needs, ensuring they receive the support necessary to succeed in school.



The Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) is a federal initiative designed to provide financial relief to working families and reduce poverty.

To make filing easier and more accessible, the program offers EITC recipients the option to file their tax returns either in person at dedicated Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) sites or online, giving families flexibility based on their needs. A free VITA hotline is also available to answer general questions and provide guidance.

For those interested in giving back, volunteer opportunities are available through HandsOn South Florida, where individuals can become IRS-certified volunteer tax preparers and support their community during tax season.
